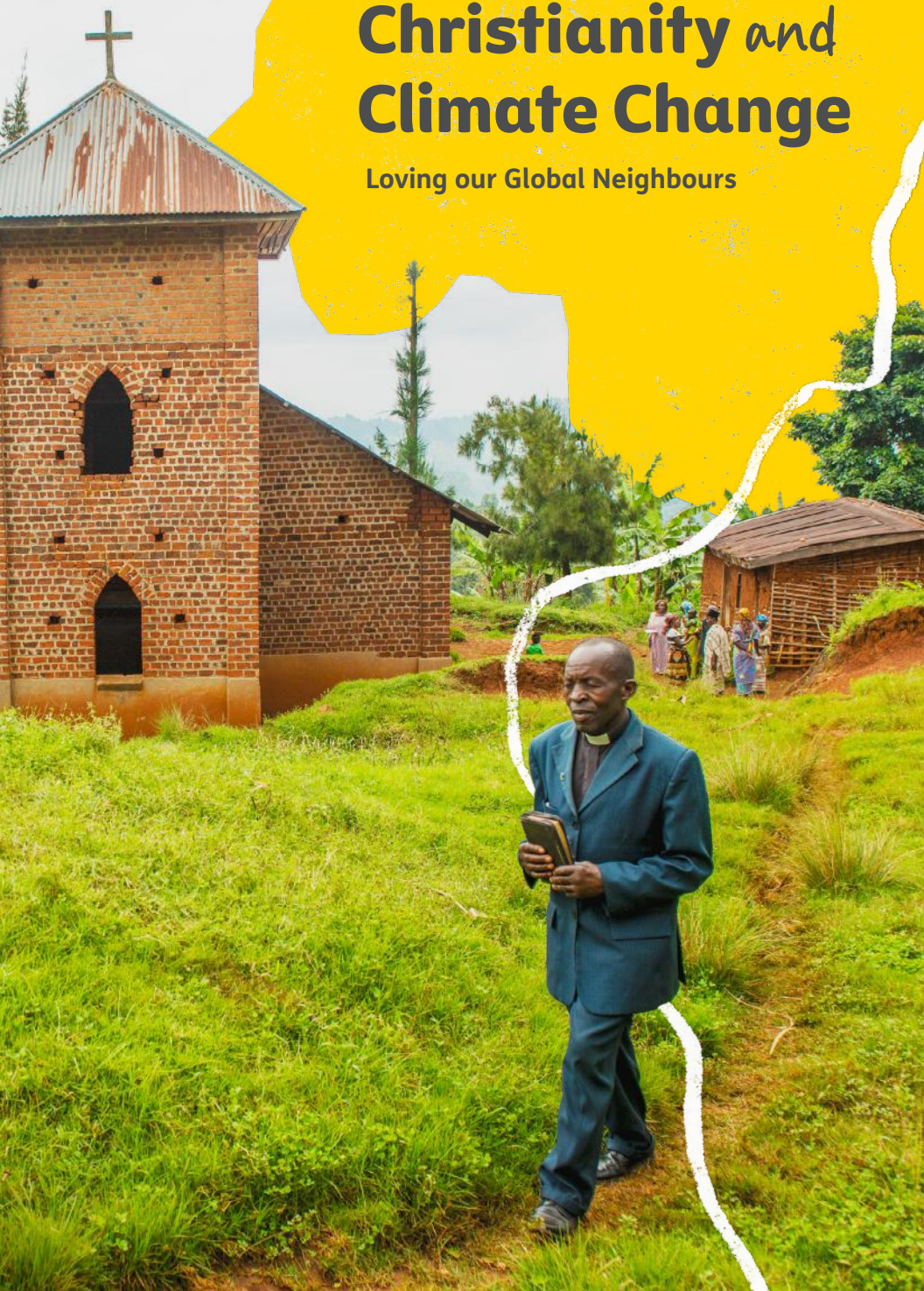

Climate change and the poor

A changing climate may be an inconvenience to us but to many families living in extreme poverty it is a matter of life and death. Droughts, floods, and disasters are making it more difficult to farm and are destroying homes and livelihoods. But there's always hope. Through Tearfund, you can help equip local churches with the tools they need to adapt to these new challenges.

How a changing climate is affecting those living in poverty:



Hunger

Ten to fifteen years ago the rains were predictable and steady. Today, they come late or not at all. When they do come, they are no longer gentle, but torrential; washing away valuable topsoil. For the first time in decades, global hunger is on the rise.



Disasters

Disasters such as drought and cyclones are becoming more frequent and severe. **In East Africa, it was normal to have a severe drought once a decade. Now it is once in 3 years**—leaving families unable to recover. Without safety nets, families scape by and remain in perpetual poverty.



Conflict

The increase scarcity of resources such as food and water increases the likelihood of conflict between people groups. Many recent conflicts (Syria, South Sudan) has been caused in part or exacerbated due to climate change.

What the Bible says

‘For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers of rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him.’

Colossians 1:16

God loves his creation. From the beginning, we see how God is intimately involved in creation—and how he called it good. From within the garden, God entrusted humankind to steward and take care of creation, to help tend to it and help it flourish.

Unfortunately, we know that it didn’t turn out this way. When the fall happened, it not only broke our relationship with God, but also with each other and creation itself. But amazingly, right from the start, God had a plan to make all things new.

We believe that Christ came not only for salvation but also to restore all of creation. Francis Schaeffer, an American theologian and pastor expressed it this way “The Christian message begins with the existence of God forever, and then with creation. It does not begin with salvation. We must be thankful for salvation, but the Christian message is more than that.”

Today as image bearers, we have responsibility for God’s creation. We are to be stewards of God’s world, working for the good of His creation. We cry out for justice and look forward to when Christ comes again and all things are fully restored.

Lebiso has been a farmer for the past 15 years and lives in Hobicha, Ethiopia with his wife and 6 children. The landscape is picturesque – characterized by hilly terrain, large plains, valleys and gorges. But beneath the serene landscape, there is suffering.



“The climate has changed, and it has harmed us a lot and made farming difficult.” Lebiso tells us. “As the weather changes, it causes rainfall fluctuations and untimely rainfalls, which often destroys the crops.”

Like many families in the region, Lebiso relies on rain-fed agriculture for his livelihood and to feed his children. For many years, this was enough. Rains were predictable and steady. But now, thanks to a changing climate, things have changed. Last year it didn’t rain for 4 months. The usual way of farming doesn’t work anymore.

“As a result we have a low harvest, and thus a lack of food, and income. We have suffered. My children have suffered as well.”



Through these simple farming methods, Lebiso was able to increase his harvest yields by 71%!

“Before, even though we put in all the effort, it did not yield results or big harvests. After, the church taught us about soil development, I started harvesting much more! We have even been able to sell some in the market.”

“I have many plans for the future. Things happen according to God’s will and I am implementing the new farming practice across my farmland. There are plants that can I can plant to cover the ground. Not only do these prevent water loss, I can also sell them. That way, I can increase my income, and cover the school fees for my children.”

“Climate change is significantly eroding many people’s ability to thrive in the world’s harshest places. The good news is that living life to the full in the face of a changing climate is possible. With a renewed mindset and more sustainable practices using local resources we can co-create a future of opportunity and hope.”
